

Lye Community Carnival

With a grant from the Commonwealth Legacy Fund, the people of Lye were asked what they would like to see happen, and a Carnival was top of the list.

So with only 12 weeks to arrange it all, the lovely local people from Dudley Healthy Communities asked for volunteers to form an organising group.

As Bethel was involved from the very early

days of Lye Carnival back in the 1920s, and we try to be the church in the community, Jane went along to the meetings to represent Bethel. Along with the Healthy Communities team, representatives from Christ Church, United Church, Lye Community Centre, Black Country Radio and local residents made up the small organising group, with back up from Dudley Communications Team.

With some restrictions as to what we could do, and mixed thoughts on how a Carnival in the current Lye might go down, Carnival Day soon arrived and although the weather did its best to put a dampener on things, the people of Lye came together and had a smashing day, with lots of entertainment, stalls and a small funfair. Christ Church opened up their building for refreshments, toilets and tours of the bell tower and Bethel had a Kindness Stones stall, where lots of people, young and old, decorated stones with kind messages to share with others in the locality.

It was a lovely day of community and networking. Now, we need to see if we can organise another one next year, putting into practice the lessons learned from

this one but with our own local committee and raising our own funds!

Depression and PTSD are now at a stable stage, I would not have come this far without my Bethel family and friends. I pray every day. And the more I come to Bethel, the stronger my faith is. I have found love which I have never had before.

I struggle sometimes with the word of God but I manage the best I can. So when I am at home I do some bible study to see if it will help me more. I am a child of God. I did religious education at school and I struggled with it, but I think I do ok.

I have lived on my own for 12 years and I never thought I could do it as new things and places scare me. The first time I walked into Bethel was the week after my grandad's funeral. It's where I feel safe and it's where I can come and have some quiet time and I know nobody can hurt me anymore.

I never thought I would step into another church when I got kicked out of Chawn Hill, after I was baptised, until my grandad mentioned Bethel and I have never looked back, it was the best thing I ever did.

Skittles Evening




It's becoming a bit of a tradition for the first Friday in November to be Skittles Night!


